



CSEF

"The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. Eligible students will receive \$125 per annum which will be paid directly to the school. Eligibility will be subject to the parent's Centrelink Health Care Card being valid on the first day of term one or two. A copy of the concession card is required with each application. Parents are encouraged to lodge the application form by **29 February 2016**, so that payment can be made from March. HEAD LICE FACTS

A female louse will lay between three to eight eggs (nits) per day on the hair. The eggs are attached to the hair fibres within 1.5 cm of the scalp, and rely on warmth from the head to hatch. Head lice do not have wings or jumping legs, so they cannot fly or jump from head to head. They can only crawl.

People get head lice from direct head-to-head contact with another person who has head lice. This can happen when people play, cuddle or work closely together. Head lice are most common among children and their families. If your family has head lice, tell anyone who had head-to-head has contact with them, so that they can check and treat their family if needed. There is no need to treat the whole

family, unless they also have head lice.

Concentrate on treating the affected person's head. There is no evidence to suggest that you need to clean the house or the classroom. The only linen that requires changing is the affected person's pillowcase.



The itchiness may not disappear immediately after treatment. Persistent itch is not a reason to repeat the treatment.


