-Mr Chazbek and the Specialist team for organising and coordinating the event


-The school student leaders who were involved in setting up and leading activities

# •LET'S TALK\*\*

Almost all children learn to speak through practice, with little or no formal instruction, but learning to talk requires time. It also requires good role models to demonstrate the correct uses and pronunciation of words, correct grammar and uses of expression.

Oral language is an essential part of the development and success a child has in all areas of literacy. Research indicates that children who have strong oral language skills learn to read and write with greater ease than their peers with less knowledge of vocabulary and language.

There are many simple ways parents and care-givers can assist in improving a child's oral language.

- Engage your child in conversation by listening carefully, asking questions and provoking thoughts and discussions
- Encourage your child to interact with other children, especially in mixed aged play groups
- Reinforce good habits of speech by modelling appropriate language, including expression, grammar and vocabulary
- Read to your child, regularly and at length using a variety of genres
- Encouraging storytelling, both orally and in written form so children understand the link between speech and writing
- Let your child explain things to you
- Ensure you are not 'talking for them' by finishing their sentences or cutting them off

Take every opportunity to encourage and increase oral language whenever you get the chance - in the car, at the dinner table or before bed, because the skills they develop now will be beneficial to their success at school and for the rest of their lives.
