## Exploring maths with your child

Maths is everywhere around us. We are constantly using maths in our everyday lives. There are so many opportunities to explore maths concepts with your child. Here are some ideas for encouraging maths 'talk' and engagement with younger children (pre-school – grade 2).

### **Playing shop**

Collect food and grocery items and label them with prices or cut pictures out of shopping catalogues. Practice paying for items using notes and coins. Make paper money or use play money to buy and sell goods from the shop. Order the food items depending on cost. Introduce kitchen scales to weigh some food such as a box of tea bags or a bag of rice and order items by weight.

### **Playing games**

Dice are a great addition to any toy collection. Roll the dice and say, make or write the numbers identified. Roll the dice and add the numbers together to find the total. Play board games like Snakes and Ladders, Connect 4, Trouble, Twister, Junior Monopoly or Battleship. Play number games online.

### Making patterns

Recognising and making patterns are important maths skills for exploring numbers, shapes and symmetry. Identify and explain visual patterns on clothing, wrapping paper or cards. Use coloured pegs, blocks or beads to begin a pattern for your child to continue. Encourage your child to draw, create and describe their own patterns. Use them for borders or greeting cards.

### **Measuring things**

Use a wall measuring chart to measure the height of people in your family. Use a cut piece of string to measure the objects in your house. Ask your child to identify anything that is the same length, or bigger than or smaller than the string. Explore other ways of measuring using a cup, jug, teaspoon, icy pole sticks, foot prints or hand lengths. Build towers of blocks to compare heights and count and add totals.

### Go on a number hunt

With your child find numbers around you, for example house numbers, calendars. Look at and say the numbers on car number plates, signs, calendars, newspapers, shopping catalogues or speed signs. Use different numbers as the starting point for practising counting, for example start counting from 6 or 10. Ask your child to count forwards and backwards. Ask what number comes before or what number comes after. Use a calculator.

### **Moving with maths**

These ideas use movement of the body, hearing sounds, using eyes and feeling with hands to experience counting. How many throws can we do without dropping the ball? How many jumps does it take to get to...?

How many times can you tap the balloon before it touches the ground? How long does it take you to skip to ....?

The list of things to do with maths is endless. Next week..... Things to do with older children (grade 3 - 6)
