How Your Child's Mindset Influences Their Growth

"If parents want to give their children a gift, the best thing they can do is to teach their children to love challenges, be intrigued by mistakes, enjoy effort, and keep on learning." Professor Carol Dweck.

Children using a growth mindset have the above gift. They realize that natural talent or intelligence is only a starting point from which real progress begins. Children and adults with a growth mindset think that they can learn or do nearly anything through dedication and hard work. This outlook tends to kindle a passion for learning and a willingness to keep trying in the face of mistakes or failure.

Some children and adults have a *fixed mindset*. When using a fixed mindset, they may think that their abilities and qualities (athleticism, music, academic) are simply static and unchanging traits - things that either you're born with or you're not. Therefore they do not respond positively to challenges or failure. As a consequence people with a fixed mindset believe they cannot change the outcomes no matter what actions they take, or how much hard work they put in.

How would you and your child answer the following:

- If you are successful at a given task, do you attribute it to hard work and effort? How about luck? Or perhaps your own abilities or intelligence? Is it possible that you'd even give credit to someone who helped you?
- If you fail at a task, is it due to your lack of effort and hard work? Bad luck? Lack of talent or help?
