Maryborough RACV Energy Breakthrough HPV Event

Last week Hillsmeade's two Human Powered Vehicle (HPV) teams attended the RACV Energy Breakthrough HPV event at Maryborough. The students, teachers and parent(s) of the students attended the event from Wednesday 16 - Saturday 19 November.

The RACV Energy Breakthrough provides opportunities for students, teachers, parents and local industry to work together to design and construct a vehicle, a machine or innovation in technology that will represent an 'energy breakthrough'.

The program encourages participants to examine and use the latest technology while considering its impact on the environment and the way people live locally and globally.

School groups work throughout the year to design, build and test vehicles or machines within detailed specifications.

It requires a team effort and an across-the-curriculum approach. These groups then bring their vehicles and machines to Maryborough in the Central Goldfields Shire, Victoria, for a huge celebration in which they can demonstrate and trial them in action.



On Thursday the teams completed their presentations, attended scrutineering, course practice and prepared themselves for the main race event. Members of Hillsmeade were interviewed on the local radio station

The main race event began at 12pm Friday and the teams were required to race their vehicles for eight hours against the competing schools on the HPV racetrack.

The teams were again in action at 6am Saturday morning and raced for a further six hours. Presentations were held at the completion of the Saturday session.

Helping your child to Read, Write, Speak and Listen.

TURNING maths into a story

By presenting mathematics as a story children can make links to their everyday life. Begin by reading books to your child that include numbers and counting.

Turn everyday events or objects into a maths story:

- 76. Count the fruit in the fruit bowl.
- 77. Cut fruit into six pieces.
- 78. Count the pieces of toast you cooked at breakfast.
- 79. Add the total of cutlery at the table.
- 80. Count the number of people travelling in the car or the bus.

Encourage your child to draw and talk about the number of things in the pictures they have drawn. Write down your child's ideas as a story. Here are some



If you got to be the teacher tomorrow what would you do?


