The overall objective of the annual Attitudes to School Survey is to collect data about the opinions of students from Years 4 to 12 to assist schools with planning, developing curriculum and improving student outcomes.

The survey assists schools to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and their experience of school. It provides schools with valuable data on students' views of their wellbeing, teaching, learning and school in general. The refreshed survey is aligned to the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes and will provide schools with actionable insights in key elements for school improvement.

The refreshed survey will be conducted online for students in Years 4 to 12 from 22 May to 23 June 2017.

School Improvement Team


