# **Intervention and EAL support**

At Hillsmeade P.S we have several programs to assist students who need extra support, as well as programs catering for extending our students.

The **Levelled Literacy Intervention** provides regular intensive small group instruction which supplements classroom literacy in the Early Years. (Di Poulter, Jo Monrroy, Kathryn Kidd).

The **English Language Support** is a small group program aiming to develop student oral language and vocabulary. (Angela Cooper)

The **Extension in Excellence** program is designed for our high achieving Grade 6 students to extend their knowledge and thinking. Students explore literacy and numeracy skills at a more advanced level. (Meg Yates).

The **Oral Language** program looks to support student oral language skills leading to improved learning in other key learning areas. (Kathryn Kidd).

**Support** in reading, writing and maths is offered to Grade 3, 4 and 5 students with regular small group instruction. (Sharron Porter, Judy Kenny).

# English as an Additional Language (EAL) Program

I have had the pleasure of working at Hillsmeade since its opening in 2003. During this time I have worked as a classroom teacher, focusing mainly in the junior school. I have recently joined the Intervention team, assisting with the EAL program (English as an Additional Language).

As the Hillsmeade school population now includes a number of families who speak an additional language, this program is an exciting opportunity to assist our students. Although they are privileged to share another language with their friends and families, the Victorian curriculum acknowledges the need to support our English language learners.

As part of the Intervention team, I am developing programs to support these students. Prep and grade one English learners attend EAL sessions with me for three 30 minute classes per week. Students participate in a number of 'hands on' and formal activities which allow them to practise speaking English, build their vocabulary and undertake learning in a small group situation. These learning opportunities have already shown increased achievement for our students.

Our English learners are also supported within their classrooms through collaborative planning which caters for multiple skill levels. Classroom teachers also have access to professional readings and information from the EAL network to support them in catering for our students.

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# Year 6 Extension in Excellence - Numeracy

How many blades of grass are on the Hillsmeade oval? How many individual squares of toilet paper do we have at Hillsmeade? How much rubbish do we throw out in a year at Hillsmeade?

This term, our Extension in Excellence students have been challenged with real world problem solving scenarios inspired by the work of Italian physicist Enrico Fermi. Fermi was famous for using meagre information to solve seemingly impossible problems.

Our students have been using rough estimates, educated guesses and real world data collection to calculate, formulate and solve these problems. They have been considering all variables within the problem and also make allowances and assumptions based upon these variables. They justify and explain all assumptions and variations in their answer.

"At first the problem seems impossible to work out, but then we analyse what it's asking us. We think about the variables and how they affect how the problem is solved. Sometimes we need to gather extra data to work it out. It is ok for our answers to be different to each other's as we may have made different assumptions and estimations."

Senior News: Last term we ended up with 6 students competing at the regional championships for Cross Country which is a huge event. Congratulations to Jayde Dykes, Hailee Geddes, Ella Ryan, Cloe Donaldson, Shae Lewis and Emily Henry who competed on that day. The Lightning Premiership was played last term at Hillcrest and it was a very successful day. Boys' soccer made it to the divisional finals which was held at Hillsmeade on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July. All boys put in a valiant effort but Cranbourne Carlisle came out overall winners. This term there is no interschool sport and soon we will begin training for the next Lightning Premiership sports which are Softball, Basketball, Rounders, Cricket and Volley Stars. In Physical Education we have been focussing on basketball, and students from grades 3 – 6 have been given the opportunity to play in Hoop Time teams in two separate competitions. Grades 3 and 4 played on the 31<sup>st</sup> of July, and grades 5 and 6 will play on the 16<sup>th</sup> of August. Hillsmeade Athletics was held last term, and the successful competitors will soon be named in a team to compete on the 9<sup>th</sup> of August at Casey Fields. In a week's time, grades 3/4/5/6 will begin a four week unit on badminton with professional coaches. This is a 'Sporting Schools' booked event and we are very excited to be able to present it.

Junior News: In Physical Education in grades Prep, One and Two we continue to teach engaging tagging games for warming up. We ensure that all students stay active during classes through engaging activities, skill sets and games. Our main focus, in accordance with the Victorian Curriculum is on different forms of locomotion and fundamental motor skills. Recently we have been practising the skills involved in basketball, and even beginning some modified games. Whist the older grades play badminton the younger grades will focus on different forms of striking in rotational activities. Look out for Junior Cross Country later in Term 4!



# **MANDARIN**

Our Mandarin program aims to develop students' understanding about the role of language and culture in communication. Under the whole school approach, we are exploring the relationship between language, culture and learning.

In Term 3 2017, students will continue using spoken Chinese to communicate with teachers and peers. They will also develop an understanding of Chinese culture through viewing movie clips, performing Chinese songs and reproducing Chinese stories.

We have been using different activities to engage students at each year level. Junior year level students are learning Chinese words and sentence structures through hands-on activities, songs and stories. Senior year level students will continue learning language and culture through using ICT tools, role-play and presentation.

The students are demonstrating great interest in learning Mandarin and we are proud of how much they have achieved in this program. We are sure that we are going to have lots of fun in Term 3!

# **MUSIC**

It has been fantastic to see so many smiling and enthusiastic students over the past few weeks ready to face new challenges and opportunities this semester. Term 3 promises to be a busy and exciting term in the music department!

In <u>Prep</u>, students will develop their skills in keeping a steady beat through singing, dancing and playing a variety of percussion instruments. They will explore creating and responding to high and low sounds and fast and slow music.

In <u>Year 1</u> and <u>Year 2</u>, students will be developing their knowledge of beat and rhythm through a variety of 'hands on' practical music making activities and games. They will continue to develop their singing skills.

Year 3 students will be challenged to learn how to play the recorder. They will also study instruments in the orchestra and how to recognise the sound of individual instruments.

Year 4 students will be learning techniques to play the ukulele and will use these to play and sing along to a variety of music.

<u>Year 5</u> will experience playing the guitar and keyboard. They will be learning to play chords to accompany a variety of songs in whole class music making.

<u>Year 6</u> students will further develop their individual skills in instrumental playing by choosing an instrument that they wish to study. They will unite as a whole class to perform songs to an audience.

Finally, both the Junior and Progressive Choirs will be performing in assembly and the students taking part in the Victorian State Schools Spectacular will be performing at the Hisense Arena.



# **VISUAL ART**

<u>Prep</u> students will be learning to develop their drawing, painting and collage skills. They will be using stencils for tracing and a variety of different painting techniques.

Year 1 students will be learning about portrait art. They will be creating a variety of portrait artworks that use different artistic skill and media.

Year 2 students will be looking at the artists Dean Russo and Paul Klee before creating artworks inspired by these






