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#### School Improvement Team Meeting

Last Friday the Hillsmeade School Improvement Team, made up of myself, Sarah Smith, Crystal Wells, Dimple Bhardwaj, Rachel Hicks, Carmen Collins and Judy Kenny met with our Senior Education Improvement Leader (SEIL) Leonie King to review our 2017 AIP targets. It was a wonderful meeting, with great celebrations of our achievemnts so far and great reflection and planning as to where to focus next. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the SIT for their dedication, commitment and focus in monitoring the goals and targets of this year's AIP. This is important work, and we thank them for their contributions.

#### Southern Melbourne Area Principal Forum

On Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November, Jodie Bray (Principal) and I attended the Southern Melbourne Area Principal Forum at the Cardinia Cultural Centre in Pakenham.

The forum was opened by the Secretary of the Victorian Department of Education, Gill Callister. Gill discussed the state education targets and progress. She announced that the recent NAPLAN results identified Victoria as the leading state in achievement across literacy and numeracy for 2017.

The Regional Director for Southern Melbourne, Stephen Gniel addressed the key elements of adopting a systemic approach to education in schools across Victoria. This included the implementation of the Victorian Curriculum and key state initiatives such as FISO (The Framework for Improving Student Outcomes), Professional Learning Communities and the HITS (High Impact Teaching Strategies).

Mark Anderson, Senior Education Improvement Leader for Southern Melbourne, discussed the development and implementation of the Annual Implementation Plans (AIP) in schools. AIPs directly address the goals in the school's four year strategic plan. AIPs include key improvement strategies based on a logical sequence of actions, are data and evidence informed and are adaptive to feedback.

The government funded Professional Practice days for 2018 were discussed by Tony Bugden, Executive Director of People Division for DET. As part of the recent Teacher Enterprise Bargaining Agreement the state government committed to funding four professional practice days each year for all teaching staff over the next four years. Discussion centred on how individual schools would administer and facilitate the four professional practice days for their staff.

The forum finished with discussion on four new pilot initiatives of the Department of Education. The initiatives focussed specifically on the health and well-being of school principals. Feedback was requested in reference to support measures for new principals, management of increasing workload and compliance requirements and the ongoing commitment to the state education targets in improving student outcomes.

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## Asthma First Aid

#### Sit the person upright

- Be calm and reassuring
- Do not leave them alone

#### **Give 4 separate puffs of blue/grey reliever puffer**

- <u>Shake</u> puffer
- Put <u>1 puff</u> into spacer
- Take <u>4 breaths</u> from spacer

Repeat until **<u>4 puffs</u>** have been taken

Remember: <u>Shake, 1 puff, 4 breaths</u>

OR give 2 separate doses of a Bricanyl inhaler (age 6 & over) or a Symbicort inhaler (over 12)



#### Wait 4 minutes

 If there is no improvement, give <u>4 more separate puffs of</u> <u>blue/grey reliever</u> as above

OR give 1 more dose of Bricanyl or Symbicort inhaler



### If there is still no improvement call emergency assistance - Dial Triple Zero (000)

- Say 'ambulance' and that someone is having an asthma attack
- Keep giving <u>4 separate puffs</u> every <u>4 minutes</u> until emergency assistance arrives

OR give 1 dose of a Bricanyl or Symbicort every 4 minutes - up to 3 more doses of Symbicort

Call emergency assistance immediately - Dial Triple Zero (000)

- If the person is not breathing
- If the person's asthma suddenly becomes worse or is not improving
- If the person is having an asthma attack and a reliever is not available
- If you are not sure if it's asthma
- If the person is known to have Anaphylaxis follow their Anaphylaxis Action Plan, then give Asthma First Aid

Blue/grey reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma




We ask parents not to bring dogs onto the school grounds before 4:30pm during school days. There have been a growing number of dogs being brought onto school grounds
