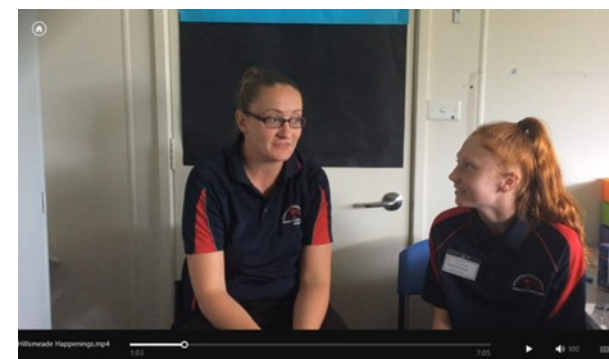
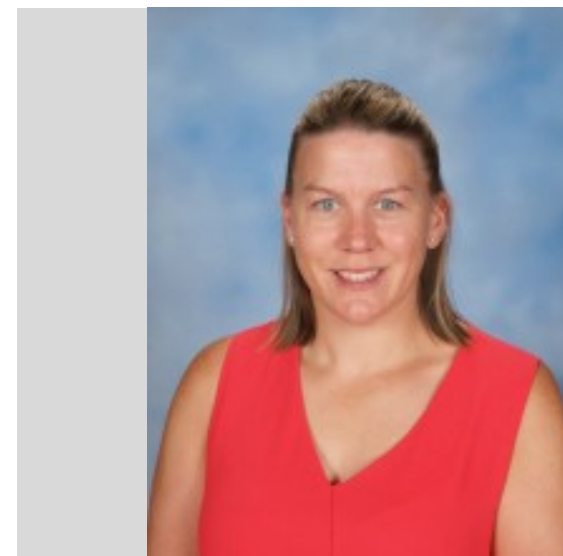
# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

## Grade 1 Hatching Chickens

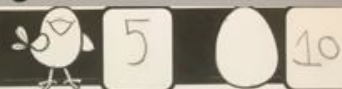

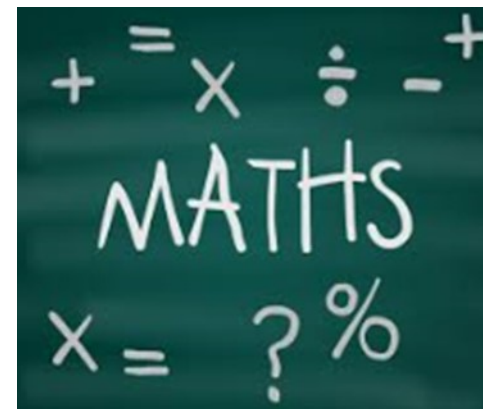
## Curriculum Day

Hillsmeade Primary are looking forward to this wonderful professional learning opportunity.

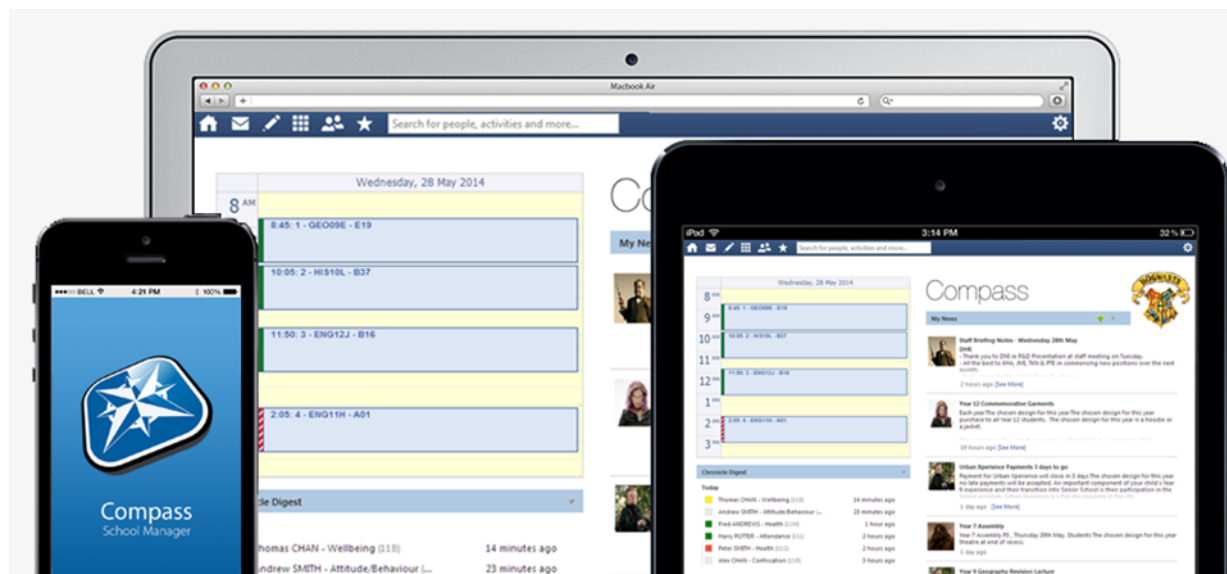

Some of the words that I found were lost, cold and depressed. After the word search we were told to draw a picture about what we thought homeless means. Everyone drew some really nice drawings. They drew people laying on the floor with no food, people begging for money, people with ripped clothes and even rich people abusing homeless people. Then we did a bit of a trivia. There were some questions like how many people do you think are homeless that are kids?, or do you think more males or females are homeless? It was really fun. The last thing we did was answer some questions about how well we think they did. So that was my experience from the homelessness Incursion.

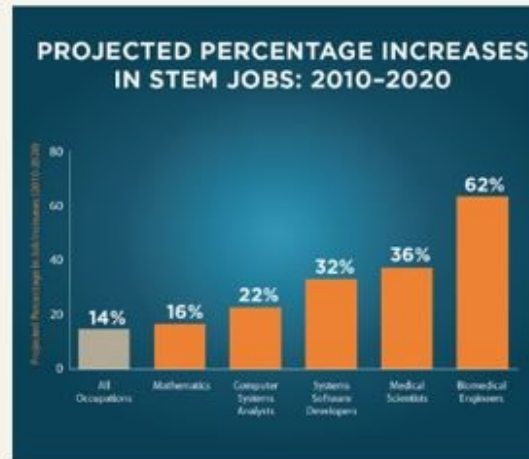


# MRS BHARDWAJ (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) STEAM

- We want our students to harness the opportunities and **meet the challenges** of the future.

Statistics to support valuing STEAM education in our schools



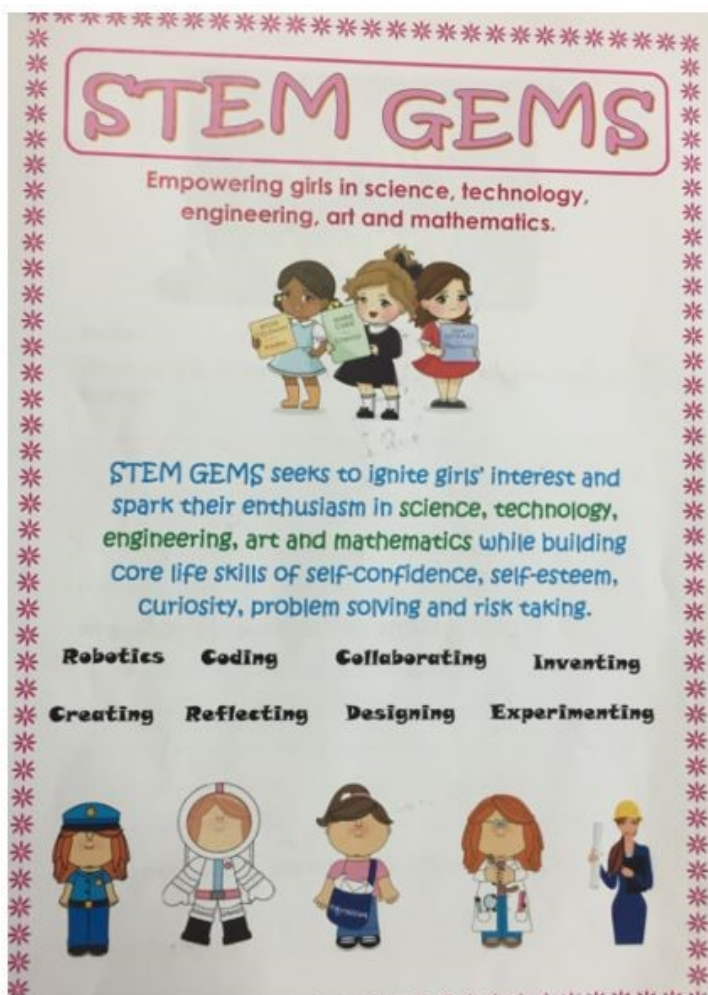
\*Engaging children in science before the ages of **11 to 14** is critical to generating long-term interest in the discipline. However, Australian primary school teachers are required to spend only **1.5-2.5 hours** on science and technology in the 30 hour school week. (PwC, 2016)

\*Year 12 participation in **STEM subjects** is declining. Over the twenty-year period from 1992 to 2012 there was a fall in participation of 11% for intermediate mathematics, 10% for biology, 5% for chemistry and 7% for physics. (PwC, 2015)

\*The percentage of students that love school reduces from **95% in Kindergarten** to **37% in Year 9**. (Jenkins, 2012)

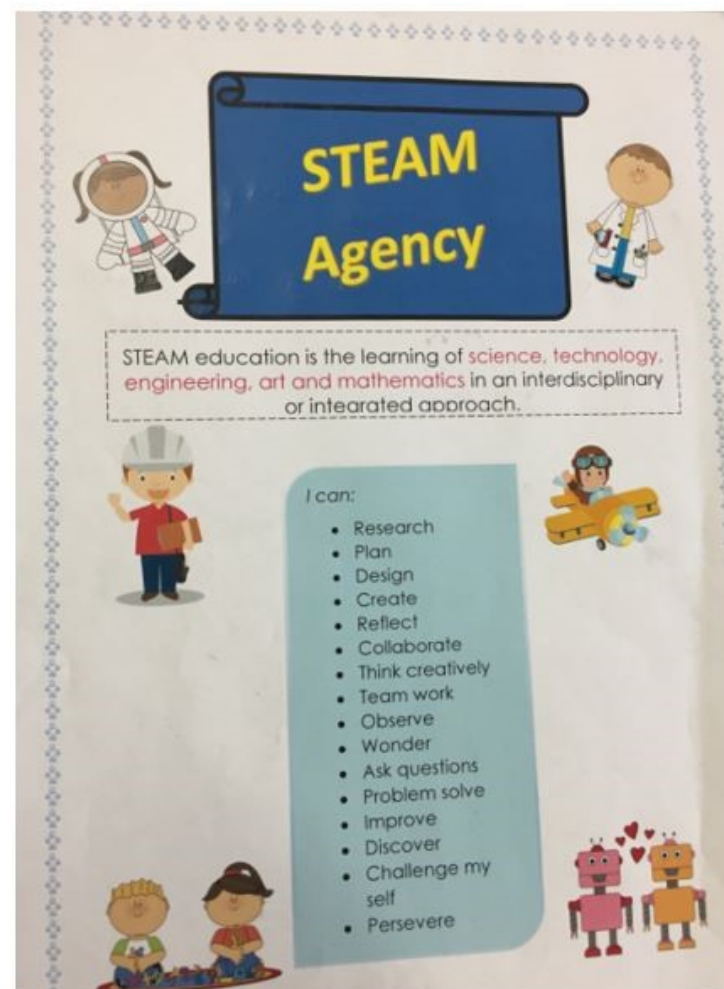
\***44% (5.1 million)** of current Australian jobs are at high risk of being affected by computerisation and technology over the next 20 years. (PwC, 2015)

Date and time: Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March at 9pm until Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> March at 9pm.

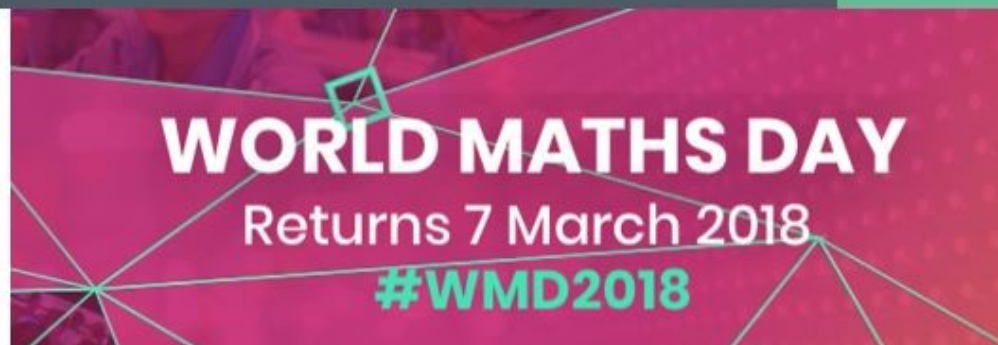

# MR CARDAMONE

Good afternoon Hillsmeade community,

This week we will look at the different types of breathing that can help us in different situations. This can be a great benefit for your children to know, especially at the primary school age. Controlled breathing can help us reduce stress, self-regulate and assist us in making better decisions under an emotional state. Practicing with your children can have a big impact on their everyday life. Below you will find a few different ways of how to control our breathing. <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Coherent Breathing</i></p> <p><i>If you have the time to learn only one technique, this is the one to try. In coherent breathing, the goal is to breathe at a rate of five breaths per minute, which generally translates into inhaling and exhaling to the count of six. If you have never practiced breathing exercises before, you may have to work up to this practice slowly, starting with inhaling and exhaling to the count of three and working your way up to six.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>1. Sitting upright or lying down, place your hands on your belly.</i></li> <li><i>2. Slowly breathe in, expanding your belly, to the count of five.</i></li> <li><i>3. Pause.</i></li> <li><i>4. Slowly breathe out to the count of six.</i></li> <li><i>5. Work your way up to practicing this pattern for 10 to 20 minutes a day.</i></li> </ol>	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Stress Relief</i></p> <p><i>When your mind is racing or you feel keyed up, try Rock and Roll breathing, which has the added benefit of strengthening your core.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>1. Sit up straight on the floor or the edge of a chair.</i></li> <li><i>2. Place your hands on your belly.</i></li> <li><i>3. As you inhale, lean forward and expand your belly.</i></li> <li><i>4. As you exhale, squeeze the breath out and curl forward while leaning backward; exhale until you're completely empty of breath.</i></li> <li><i>5. Repeat 20 times.</i></li> </ol>
<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Energizing HA Breath</i></p> <p><i>When the mid-afternoon slump hits, stand up and do some quick breath work to wake up your mind and body.</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><i>1. Stand up tall, elbows bent, palms facing up.</i></li> <li><i>2. As you inhale, draw your elbows back behind you, palms continuing to face up.</i></li> <li><i>3. Then exhale quickly, thrusting your palms forward and turning them downward, while saying "Ha" out loud.</i></li> <li><i>4. Repeat quickly 10 to 15 times.</i></li> </ol>	<p>If you would like to know more any of these techniques share, please do not hesitate to come and discuss. ### Production Update:

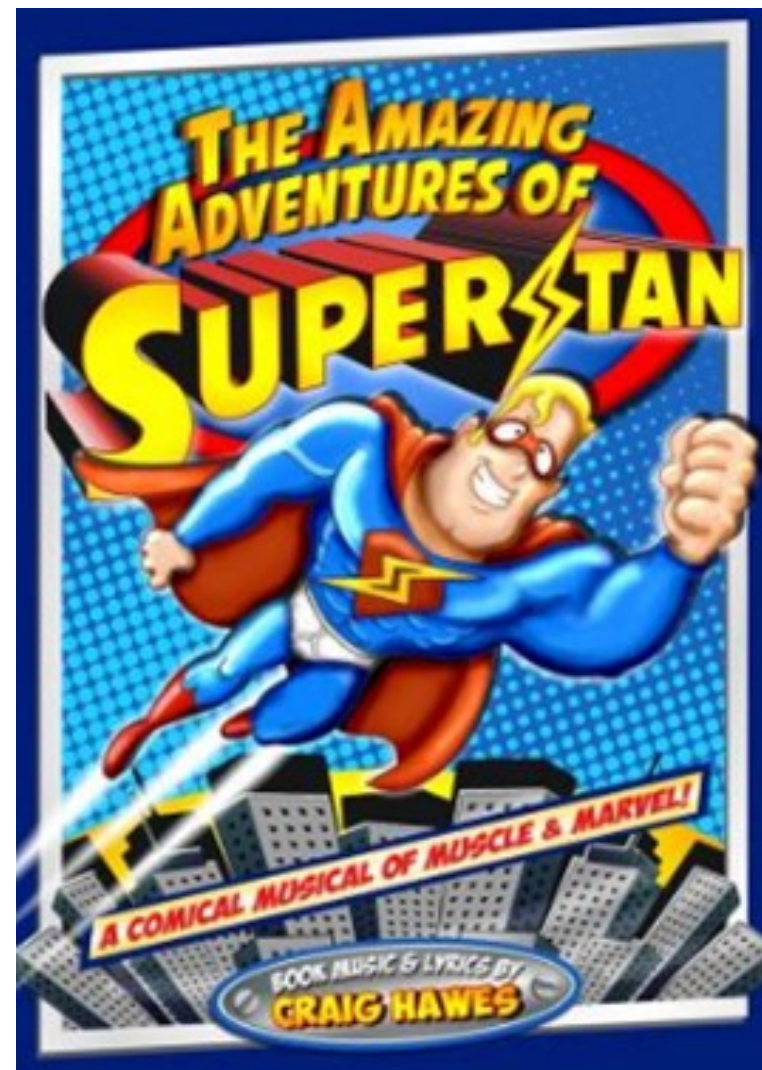

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## School Crossing Safety



There are over 60 Primary Schools in the City of Casey, serviced by over 240 school crossing supervisors. Over 35,000 students attend these schools each day, travelling by foot, private vehicles and public transport.

The City of Casey encourages drivers, parents and others responsible for children, to carefully read the information below to minimise the risk of accident or injury at and around school crossings.

### Why are school crossings important?

Young children do not have a well developed sense of danger. They also do not have well developed peripheral (side) vision or spatial sense. This makes it difficult for them to properly judge the safe time to cross a road. Supervised school crossings were formally introduced in the 1970s to protect children from this risk.

### Why do we need parking and traffic controls around school crossings?

Crossing supervisors need to have a clear field of vision in all directions around their crossing, so that they can spot approaching children and vehicles as soon as possible.

Because children are often very small, cars parked or stopped too close to crossings can completely obscure them from the view of supervisors and drivers. Coupled with children's limited ability to identify danger, this can create a very hazardous situation.

Parents and other people who are dropping off/picking up children also need reasonable access to parking for that purpose.

### What sorts of controls can I expect to find around schools?

A range of restrictions may apply according to the needs of the particular area. The following restrictions may apply at and around your school:

#### No stopping



*What does no stopping mean?*

No stopping means you cannot stop your vehicle for any purposes, no matter how short the time.

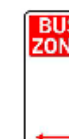
#### No parking



*What does no parking mean?*

No parking means that the area is a pick up/drop off zone and that you cannot leave your vehicle un-attended and you cannot be parked for more than 2 minutes.

#### Bus Zone



*What does bus zone mean?*

Bus zone means that this area is for buses only. You cannot stop there at all.

#### Disabled Parking



*What does disabled parking mean?*

Disabled parking means that only vehicles displaying a valid Disabled Person's parking permit may park in these spaces.

### As a driver what am I required to do around school crossings?

When approaching school crossings, slow down to 40km/h or less, watch for children and remember not to stop too close to the crossing. You **MUST** stop before the STOP LINE marked on the road once the stop sign is displayed to you

The crossing must be completely vacated of all pedestrians before proceeding, including the supervisor

Also watch for, and obey, the instructions of the School Crossing Supervisor.

Look for parking restriction signs and make sure to obey them or you may be fined

Note: If written in a language not understood by the person carrying out the verification, the document must be accompanied by an English translation from either a (signatory) at the level of Professional Translator (or above) currently accredited by the National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters Ltd (NAATI) or another accredited translator who currently holds an equivalent accreditation. NAATI is the Australian government owned National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters. Where a parent/legal guardian is a signatory to the child's account, they are required to be identified to the acceptable identification standard.

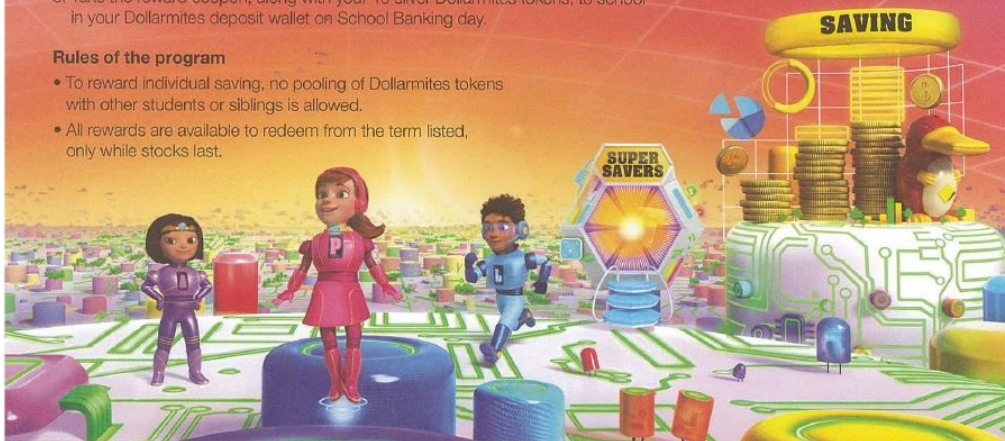

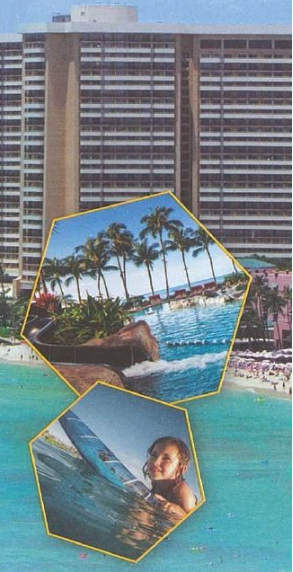
