The amount raised was a staggering \$9,404.54. This event had wonderful support from local business and the City of Casey and will now become an annual event.



### FROM MR CARDAMONE

Welcome back to Term 3!!! I hope everyone has had the opportunity to take some time out and spend quality time with their family and loved ones. This will be another big term with lots of different events happening.

At the end of this term there will be another parent workshop, the topic will be on 'self-regulation' most likely around Week 10, watch this space! If you have any questions about this, please let me know.

Over the holidays Ms Carter, Ms Paige and I had the opportunity to participate in the *Emerging Leader's* course through Bastow. This was a great two-day event. One key area I would like to share with you is a topic that Dr. Michael-Carr Gregg spoke about. It was the importance of sleep. He states that only 9% of our children are getting the adequate sleep per night (9 hours). He states that technology is a big factor and a lack of routine and structure around bedtime.

He states to improve this we need to have strict routines around bedtime, things like:

- No screen time within an hour before bed
- Expectations of when bedtime is every night
- Check noise and light in their room
- Getting their body and minds ready for bed,
   brushing of teeth, reading a book in bed etc
- Keep regular sleep and wake up times
