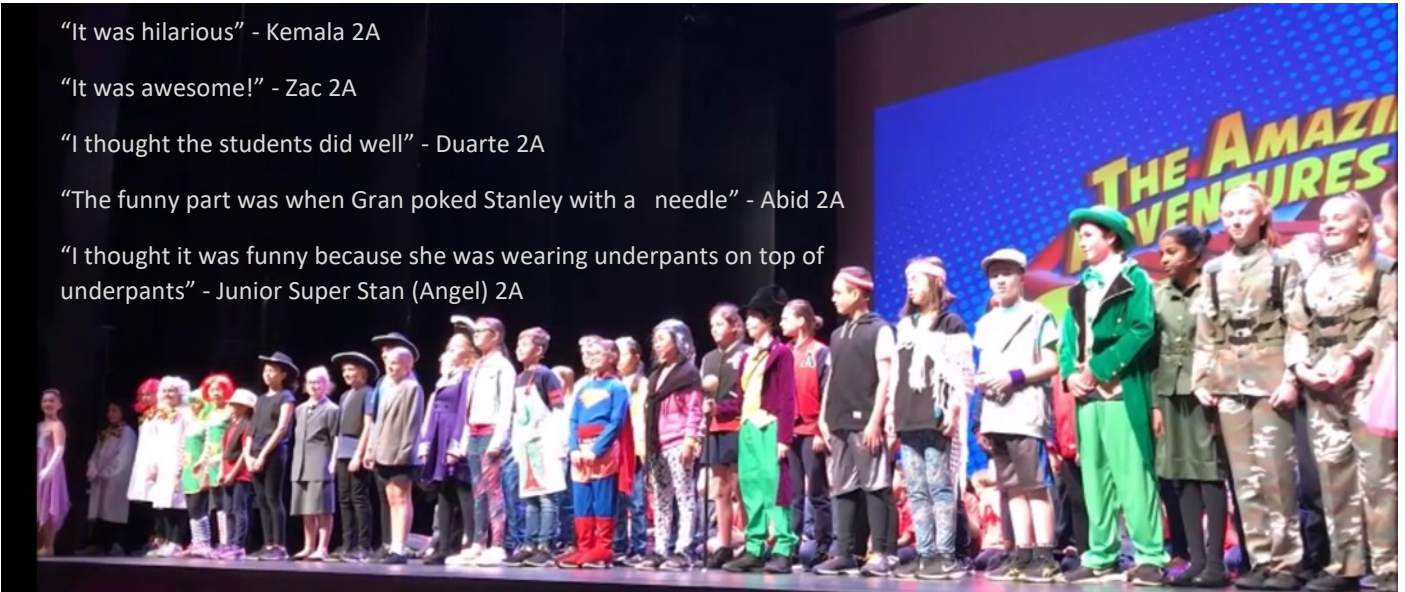

Who will be able to vote for my project idea?

Anyone who resides in your local community that is 16 years or older will be eligible to vote for your project idea.

If your project is proposed to be in metropolitan Victoria, your local community will be anyone who resides within 5km of your proposed project's location.

If your project is proposed to be in regional Victoria, your local community will be anyone who resides within 50km of your proposed project's location.

Everyone will be able to choose from a minimum of 30 projects.

Dear Hillsmeade Community,

I hope the week is going well. As some of you might be aware I have been on leave as my wife and I have had our beautiful baby boy Vincent. We are very excited by his arrival. He has been keeping us very busy!

This week I wanted to talk about the importance of diet.

We know eating healthy has lots of benefits such as maintaining weight, feeling good and our overall health. It also can impact our moods, behaviours and our productivity levels. This is critical for our young children to function at an optimal level, especially at school. A message from 'HeadSpace' (headspace.org.au)

Eat well

Eating well doesn't only reduce the risk of physical health problems, like heart disease and diabetes, but it can also help with your sleeping patterns, energy levels, and your general health and wellbeing. You might have noticed that your mood can affect your appetite and food intake. A good balanced diet with less of the bad things (e.g. junk food and lots of sugars) and more of the good things (e.g. vegies, fruit, whole grains and plenty of water) will make sure you have all of the vitamins and minerals to help your body and brain function well.

Over the past month we have looked at sleep, exercise and now our diet. Implementing these together in our young children's lives can have a big impact in the way they function day to day.

At school we promote healthy eating by having 'brain breaks and fruit breaks' which gives students an opportunity to have some fruit or vegetables during the day.

In saying this, it's still important to have a balanced diet, so having the opportunity to have a pizza night or take out night, whether that's once a week or once a month, this can be turned into a family ritual, which is important for family development and growth.

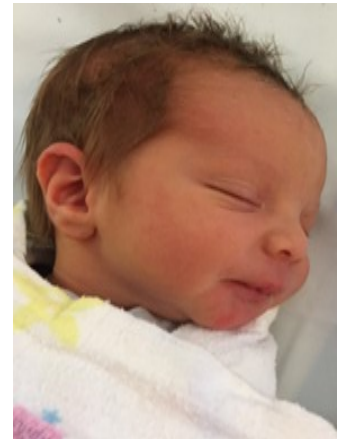

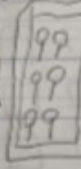

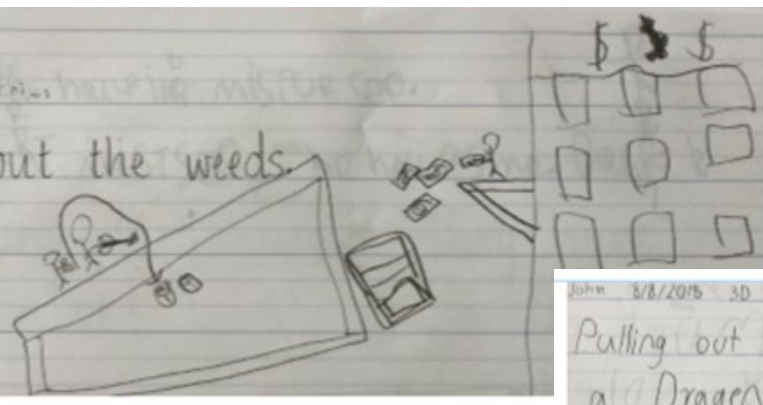

FROM MS SZALEK

STEAM Professional Learning

Last Friday the 10th of August, Jess Szalek, Dimple Bhardwaj and Martine Ziino attended the 7th Annual STEAM Conference – *Ignite Innovate Integrate* at Kingswood Primary School. It was an enlightening and exciting day, with each of us learning new things and experimenting with robotics and technology.



The day began with an amazing introduction from Bruce Armstrong, the inaugural Director of the Bastow Institute of Educational Leadership; he entertained the idea of driverless cars, the environmental impacts of technology and predicted that within the next 30 years, 30% of school/work will be through the use of virtual reality.

A few notable workshops involved ‘coding with drones’ and ‘Scratch programming’ with the former demonstrating the complexity and development of robotics and how it is used around the world today (such as the drone display as part of the recent winter Olympics opening ceremony). We explored the use of drones in the maths classroom, including the use of directional language, measurement, angles and problem solving with coding. The use of coding was also utilised in the ‘drag and drop coding’ of Scratch. Scratch is a programming language that makes it easy to create your own Interactive stories, animations, games, music and art; showing how diverse coding is across the different domains of the curriculum. “As young people create and share Scratch projects, they learn important mathematical and computational ideas.” Students are also learning to think creatively, reason systematically and work collaboratively- many expected 21st century skills.

The final presenter for the day was *Beyond Superhuman*, Dr Jordan Nguyen. Dr Nguyen is an Australian biomedical engineer and inventor; he invented a wheelchair controlled by the mind to assist people living an immobile life, such as those with ‘locked in syndrome.’ Dr Nguyen is currently exploring the world of virtual reality and augmented reality, interviewing and recreating people and personalities in the digital world. He also discussed the values of the future, particularly autonomous cars, noting that they will be a “much safer way to travel,” as robots cannot get distracted and the software will be continuously updated with a complete data memory, meaning that all cars will be learning from each other and adapting to their surroundings each and every day. He finished his presentation with the challenge to others, the pinnacle of his success and to lead a happy and fulfilling life, but put simply, *find what inspires you.*

In the workshop, we have been exploring how to develop students' Intercultural Capability by using a whole-school approach. We also investigated the best teaching practices to address the Global Citizenship dimension of the Framework of Student Outcomes. Through this project, we will assist our teachers to strengthen their capabilities to teach for intercultural understanding, and to help students develop the 21st century skills to be successful in an 'increasingly complex and interconnected world'.

Our school has a strong focus on internationalising education. By participating in the Intercultural Champions Pilot Project, we will work closely with our school leaders to design a whole school curriculum that delivers rich intercultural learning experiences to our students.

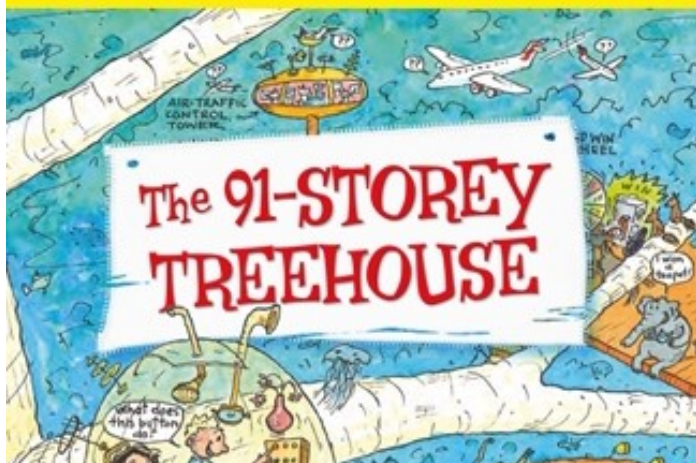
