Principal for a day 2018



About the Laptop Program

A 'Laptop Program' provides students with personal portable computers to enhance opportunities for learning. The program helps schools engage the digital generation by nurturing individual learning experiences. This approach can increase independence and self-initiated learning in students and extend their learning beyond the classroom.

Learning experiences across the school are purposefully designed to develop the attributes of a global learner. In this way, each student learns to develop and demonstrate the knowledge, skills and practices required in the digital world. The intent is to provide our students with "anywhere, anytime" inclusive, engaging learning.

Why Hillsmeade Primary School implements a student laptop program

Hillsmeade's Laptop Program provides an environment where grade 5/6 students have the **option** to have access to a personal laptop computer as well as digital content and educational software. Benefits of the school laptop program include: increasing student engagement in learning, personalising instruction and facilitating student collaboration. Students will have immediate access to resources and information on the World Wide Web.

Student Requirement for the Laptop Program

- Students will be able to work with the laptops at school
- Students will be able to take the laptop home and return it the next day
- It will be the students' responsibility to return the laptop fully charged the next day
- Students will be required to strictly observe the 'Internet Use and Technology Policy' of the school

The managed laptop program is **not** a school requirement and the purchasing of a personal laptop is at the discretion of the parent/guardian. Students who do not purchase a personal laptop will have access to the school supplied laptops and IPADs provided in each class.

- Encourage students to write, draw and talk about what they would like to do on a special day.
- Have students write a letter or postcard to a family or friend.
- Create a story with your child about an adventure.
- Write a list of all the places you visit where you can find letters, words, instructions etc.
- Keep a holiday diary.
- Make a new game up, and write or type instructions to share with family and friends.
- Read a recipe, write a shopping list and create a meal with your child.
- Create a list of questions that they would like to ask their teacher, a book character or family member.

LIGHT IT RED FOR DYSLEXIA -AN AWARENESS PROGRAM HELD DURING OCTOBER



- Dyslexia is a learning difficulty that affects the skills needed to read words quickly and accurately. Dyslexia can also affect writing and spelling.

- Dyslexia is not an intellectual disability.
- Dyslexia is not a condition that can be cured but strategies can assist reading skills.
- Diagnosis is best undertaken by a professional educational psychologist.
- Dyslexia does not limit the potential of the person to lead an independent, full and successful life.
- People with Dyslexia often have unique abilities in thinking outside the square and being creative.


