Step 4: Pay for the photos via the shopping cart (upper right corner of the page)

Somers School Camp is the best place I've ever been to in my whole life so far.



FROM MR CARDAMONE

Good afternoon Hillsmeade community,

Next week is The National Day of Action Against Bullying on the 15th of March. We will have a strong focus on this over the coming week. We aim to raise awareness within our community about this important topic.

Students will have the opportunity to have discussions in class on bullying and how it can affect individuals and families. Students will also have the opportunity to express their perception about what a 'No Bully Zone' looks like at Hillsmeade Primary School. Posters will be on display by the end of the week and all students will be receiving No Bully wristbands this coming Monday.

Please take this opportunity to continue this vital conversation at home with your family and friends. It is imperative that we keep discussing this topic throughout the year openly and honestly in order to equip students with the skillset to address any bullying issues that arise.

You may notice the signs of bullying. On the 'Bullying No way' website they have some useful information around this. Here is a short piece from the website:

"Signs of bullying

Each individual student who has been bullied or is bullying others will respond and act differently. A student's behaviours and moods can also change for a variety of reasons. However, the following are some signs that may Indicate a student is experiencing bullying:

Signs a parent may report:

- · doesn't want to go to school
- \cdot changes their method or route to school or are frightened of walking to school
- · changes in sleep patterns
- · changes in eating patterns
- $\cdot \textit{ frequent tears, anger, mood swings}$
- · unexplained bruises, cuts, scratches
- · missing or damaged belongings or clothes
- \cdot arriving home hungry.

Students who are more likely to be bullied are also more likely to:

- · feel disconnected from school and not like school
- · lack quality friendships at school
- \cdot display high levels of emotionality that indicate vulnerability and low levels of

Resilience

- \cdot be less well accepted by peers, avoid conflict and be socially withdrawn
- · have low self-esteem
- · be relatively non-assertive
- \cdot be different in some way".
