Cakes for a cause



This year our morning clubs have been a big success for our students, families and the community. Morning clubs have become an essential part of Hillsmeade' s makeup. We know there is evidence that building positive school connectedness is a strong indicator for students to feel safe, comfortable, assist with their academic outcomes at times and most importantly, support with their mental health. Here is a snapshot of some of the clubs that run in the morning.

Breakfast club

Attendance Notifications to Parents

Last week we sent out letters to all parents of children who have unexplained absences. An unexplained absence includes:

- Your child was away for all or part of a day, and we have not received an explanation from the parents
- Your child was late to school, but was not accompanied by a carer.

In future, we will be sending out these notices to all parents at the beginning of every month — you will get a paper copy and an email.

What Do I Do With The Notice?

All you need to do is explain the absence. You can do this in two ways:

- Via Compass website: go to your child's profile then click the Attendance tab, then click the Unexplained tab
- 2. Or: return the form to the office after writing explanations next to each absence.

You can quickly & easily add an attendance note for your child in the Compass app: the office team are always happy to help get you going with attendance and Compass.

Parking Around the School

We've recently had feedback from some parents about the parking around the school.

- We have started to use safety cones to block off problem areas such as near the front gates parents often park here and block traffic at the roundabout which slows everybody down and makes the crossing unsafe for children.

A Note from Sick Bay


