## PREP MOONLIT SANCTUARY EXCURSION

On Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> August all of our preps engaged in our excursion to Moonlit Sanctuary. This excursion was planned to provide a very 'real' experience of observing and learning about Native Australian Animals as part of our Term 3 Inquiry unit of work – Why Are Australian Animals Unique?

The day started with a very exciting bus ride which was the highlight of the event for some of our students!

The children had an action packed day which certainly extended their understanding of our native animals: their features, habitats and needs in order to survive. Protecting the environment in order to ensure these animals can continue to live in the wild was also part of the learning.

There was a discover experience which involved problem solving tasks and related discussions, this was led by our teachers. A whole host of other activities were led by presenters from the sanctuary. The children could observe, listen to information and ask questions about many animals including dingoes, owls, koalas, wedge-tailed eagles, spot-tailed quolls, kangaroos, wallabies, kookaburras and cockatoos.

Mrs Watson our Assistant Principle, The Prep Teachers and Educational Support Staff who attended were all incredibly proud of our students. The children were polite and represented Hillsmeade by showing our school values such as enthusiasm and responsibility.

Facebook is a social networking service where millions of people go to interact with others. Facebook has over one billion active users, more than half of them use Facebook on a mobile device. The user can create a personal profile with photos, lists of personal interests, contact information, and other personal information which is shared among their chosen friends.

Facebook users have the ability to interact with a wide range of individuals. Through Facebook's news feed, users have the ability to interact in public conversations with people who are not within their friends list.

#### How to make your Facebook profile private

#### Step 1

- Click on the three parallel lines at the bottom right corner of the screen.
- Stroll to the bottom and click the "Settings & Privacy' tab and click "Settings".
   Click on the Timeline and Tagging option.
- 3 Click on the Timeline and Tagging option. You can control everything with regards to who gets to post and tag on your Timeline and also who can see it. Go through all seven options and customise it for you. Activating Timeline review is also recommended. Once you've done this your Timeline will only be viewable to the people you choose to look at it.

#### Step 2

Go to the 'Privacy' tab in the settings page. Facebook offers you several different options so you can adjust exactly how private you want to be. Check your privacy settings regularly. Often when Facebook updates the settings may go back to public by default.

#### Other Privacy Settings

To manage your privacy on Facebook (on a computer), access the privacy settings by clicking on the downward facing arrow in the upper right-hand side of the page and select "Settings". In the left hand column, click on "Privacy".

To access these settings on a mobile device select the three lines on the bottom right of your screen. Scroll down to 'Settings & Privacy'. Here you can change a number of settings: Restricting who can see the users profile and timeline. Under the "Who can see my stuff?" section, users can manage who is able to access their timeline and profile. Next to 'Who can see your future posts?', dick on 'Edit' to ensure that 'Friends' is selected.

#### How can I report a fake profile?

If you have a Facebook account and want to report someone that's pretending to be you or someone you know:

- Go to the profile of the impersonating account.
- Click on the cover photo and select Report.
- Follow the on-acreen instructions for impersonation to file a report.


#### How do I block another user on Facebook?

- Click at the top right of any Facebook page.
- O Click Privacy Shortcuts.
- O Click 'How do I stop someone from bothering me?'
- Enter the name of the person you want to block and click Block.
- O Select the specific person you want to block from the list that appears and click Block again.






# Ways a Parent Can Help

# With READING!



Let your child see you reading! Have magazines and books in your home.	Help your child find a good fit book. Keep a dictionary on hand. Help your child look up new words.	Read mysteries with your child and try to figure out the clues together.
Movie version coming out? Read the book together first, then talk about which you each liked better.	Set aside a time and a place for your child to read. Like a comfy chair and a reading light in a quiet place.	Visit your public library regularly. Look for and read together the books that were your favourites when you were young.
Encourage your child to write- Letters, thank you notes, emails, journals, lists, stories about their own trips, events and daily life. Ask your child to draw a comic strip about what happens in the story. Provide word searches, crossword and other word games and puzzles, or help your child make his/ her own.	Ask your child questions about what her or she is reading such as: - What is the story about? - Who are the important people in the story? - Where does the story take place? - Why do you think that person made that choice? - What do you think will happen next? - How did you know about? - Would you recommend this book to your friends?
