
#### **NAPLAN 2019**

Some fantastic whiteboard cloud tables are starting to be Introduced into some grades. Here are some pictures from Year 2A's class and Prep A's class.



### Infinite Voyage

A downloadable application for children aged 8 to 12 and their families

Infinite Voyage is a colourful, story-based, character-driven application that features mathematicallybased challenges. Developed by the Mathematical Association of Victoria and the Game Developers' Association of Australia (GDAA), Infinite Voyage has 15 sub-games that are aligned to the Victorian Curriculum.

Infinite Voyage takes place on Spaceship VMC, which is searching for suitable places for humankind to relocate. Designed to allow up to eight different players on one device, Infinite Voyage invites players to create customised characters for themselves and family members.

With the Mathematical Association of Victoria providing advice on the mathematical content of Infinite Voyage, the app has been designed to increase confidence in and engagement with mathematics.

An information guide with discussion points and prompts for each episode is also available to parents and guardians.

- draw on young learners' social and physical experiences to demonstrate authentic mathematics in their everyday lives.

Parents and guardians are encouraged to explore the mathematical concepts underpinning the episodes with their children in a range of daily activities, for example; by using directional and positional language, identifying 2D shapes and 3D objects, talking about the likelihood of events, counting, using the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division), and measuring.

Happy week 9! Nearly the end of the term. I hope you have been planning some quality family trips/ time over the school holidays. This term we were planning our parent workshop about online safety, unfortunately we have had to cancel this event, due to the low numbers coming. We will have another parent workshop next year term 1. If you would like any information about online safety please let me know.

The calculator% app is an application that is designed to help the user hide photos and videos behind the applications screen.

This application appears to look like a calculator, but upon entering a passcode it opens up a private vault where files are stored securely and cannot be viewed in the iPhone or Androids default camera role.

#### To get files into your Private Calculator

In the app itself, you can tap the '+' sign to select Wi-Fi transfer, which gives you an IP address to type on your computer's web browser. You can also import files through your camera roll (photo's and videos).

Private Calculator can display and open a number of media types, including photo's (such as .jpeg, .gif, .bmp and .png files), videos (.mp4, .avi, .mkv, .wmv, .flv), music and audiobooks (.mp3). Microsoft Office files (.doc, .xls, .ppt), other assorted documents (.txt, .pdf) and even downloaded websites (.htm).

#### Concerns

Some of the concerns regarding this app are the fact that your child might potentially be hiding explicit photos, videos or other content.

If your child is under 18 years old it is illegal for them to produce or possess these types of images. It is classed as child abuse pictures.

Child abuse pictures are illegal if they are:

- asked for;
- taken;
- received and kept; or

sent, posted or passed around

The maximum penalties for child abuse material can be up to 15 years in jail and being placed on the sex offender register. The maximum penalty for an act of indecency is 2 years in jail if the person in the picture is under 16. If the person is over 16, the maximum penalty is 18 months in jail.

- Consider deleting this app
- Remind your kids that everything is public
  Have a dialog with your kids about sexting and sending inappropriate photos to others
- Explain to your kids that they should be careful with sharing their photos with anyone, as they can be forwarded

It is important to have open honest communication with your child regarding sexting.



## The Size Of Our Solar System



On the 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> September 2019 the Year Fives had an incursion based on our Solar System! Our class had the incursion on the 5<sup>th</sup> of September along with 5D and 5C. Our facilitator was called Mark, he taught us more about our Solar System.

The first activity we accomplished was all about us understanding how immense our sun is (in its diameter) by comparing it with all the other planets in our gigantic solar system. An example is we had a picture of a Uranus and it went from one part of the "sun" to the other. We repeated it until we got to the other side of the sun", it took us 27 ¼ repetitions before we did.

The second activity we overtook was all about, the distances from each planet (in our solar system) to the sun. This helped us figure how far apart we really are from the sun, along with how far the other planets are too (especially Neptune) it is, 500 million kilometres away from the sun). It also helped us find out how long it takes each planet to orbit around the sun. For instance did you know that it takes 165 years for Neptune to do a full orbit around our largest star in our solar system, the sun?

The last and final activity we succeeded at was, mainly about the speed of each planet. To learn more about this we had some of our class mates to act as planets each planet was given a time when they were allowed to move depending on how far away they were from the sun. the rest of the class would clap



each second "Mars" was allowed to orbit 1 step every 2 seconds we clapped repeatedly until we reached 40 claps and in total "mars" took 20 steps completed 2 full orbits around the sun. At the end of the day we all had an extravagant time, this marvellous incursion helped us grow on our existing knowledge of our colossal solar system. Mahdiah 5E

Throughout the Science Incursion, Year 5 students enjoyed learning about the Solar System. Students enjoyed learning about the Solar System and doing activities to understand the concepts of the Solar System such as spacing of the planets and the sun.
