#### Victoria - Jiangsu Principals' Forum

On Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November, Dimple Bhardwaj and I attended an international principals' forum. The Jiangsu Provence in China is the sister state of Victoria and the two have been connected through of a 40 year international partnership. We are fortunate to visit our sister school, Jinling Primary School in Nanjing, bi-annually as part of the VPA China Study Tour. The focus of the forum was around STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics), the challenges opportunities we face through global learning and engagement. We discussed the similarities and differences in curriculum and addressed underrepresented cohorts and disadvantage. The day included cultural performances and a unique opportunity for networking and strengthening international connections.

#### **Curriculum Day November 15th 2019**

During our curriculum day last Friday, teachers and support staff engaged in professional learning with Bryan Jeffrey.

Bryan is a highly regarded consultant, supporting schools, hospitals and agencies in developing their knowledge and capacity in the area of children's mental health.

An important focus of the day was about how to best support children to manage stress. Bryan discussed the importance of resisting the urge to remove all sources of stress from the lives of children and instead help prepare them for, and manage, stress in an age appropriate way. Bryan suggests teaching children about their brains, reframing signs of stress as our bodies preparing us for action and also teaching children strategies to help them relax.

### ANXIETY IN CHILDREN

#### FROM MR CARDAMONE



Dear Hillsmeade Community,

Happy week 7! I hope the week has been a positive one for you and your family.

Last Friday during our curriculum day, the staff at Hillsmeade attended a presentation delivered by Bryan

Jeffrey, a Registered Psychiatric Nurse. Bryan has spent many years working with children affected by anxiety and he shared with us the challenges and strategies involved. This presentation was a timely reminder for us to revisit this important topic.

Here are some facts about anxiety:

1 in 3 girls suffer from an anxiety disorder

1 in 5 boys suffer from an anxiety disorder

15% of Australiana's aged between 16-24 years' experience an anxiety disorder each year.

Below is some information on how you can help a young person showing signs of anxiety.

On an individual level, there are also many helpful ways you can support children and young people experiencing anxiety, depending on their developmental stage. Here are some ideas:

- Give young children the language to label how they're feeling, so they can learn to identify their emotions (for example, say, "It looks like you might be feeling a bit worried. Sometimes when I feel worried, my tummy feels wobbly").
- Give notice prior to transitions like starting or stopping activities or morning rooms to help children and young people prepare for change.
- Help children and young people understand that being anxious, particularly when confronting new situations, is normal, but also that there are strategies for managing anxious feelings.

- Help individuals recognise their own internal cues that they're becoming anxious (for example, if they have a racing heart or are unable to think, identify and practise strategies that help them to manage their anxiety and calm down).
- Use a step-by-step approach. Break tasks down into small manageable chunks, moving up a step when an individual can cope without anxiety (for example, presenting a project to an educator, presenting a project to an educator and two friends, presenting a project to a small group, and so on).
- Help children and young people recall situations where they've succeeded despite being anxious, to strengthen their self-belief they can cope with and manage their anxiety.
- Help them understand that avoiding those things that make them anxious, while useful as a short-term fix, is likely to make things harder in the future.
- Encourage children and young people to have a go at things that are new and to understand that it takes time to learn new skills or behaviours.
- Help them to recognise their own self-talk when approaching new situations and to develop some positive coping statements to stop the self-defeating talk.
- Set realistic expectations for challenges and assist children and young people to manage stress associated with tasks.
- Talk about effective and helpful strategies that you use to manage anxiety or stress (for example, talking to friends, positive self-talk, exercise and other relaxation strategies).
- Enlist the support of important people in their lives such as family members and other educators.

#### **Woolworths Discovery Tour**

In our Inquiry unit this term, 'Are You A

#### **Year 6 Walk to Casey**

As part of their MAD Day preparation, the Year 6 students attended Casey Central Shopping Centre on Wednesday November. The students conducted market research, noting the various sales techniques and strategies used by the different shops to encourage consumers to enter their store and spend money. Students also analysed the reasons behind the designs of the shop fronts, including lighting, colour, music, advertising and logos. The Year 6 students have taken this market research and applied it to their own MAD Day stall preparation and are looking forward to a successful MAD Day on 29<sup>th</sup> November.



#### **Student Leadership Team 2020**

On behalf of the panel members I would like to thank all the year 5 students who wrote and submitted applications. We were very proud of each and every student. The applications have been scored against the Student Leadership Rubric and students were notified on Thursday of shortlisting.

All shortlisted applicants are to now **make a short video** to be viewed by the current students leadership team and the year 4 and 5 students next Tuesday, prior to presenting their speech on Wednesday morning. We met today at recess to share the expectations of this.

The video will include:

- Introduction of student
- Sharing of which captain role the student is campaigning for
- Explaining to the voting students why they wish to be a captain at Hillsmeade Primary School
- Explaining what skills they have that would make them the best candidate
- Share what ideas they have to contribute to Hillsmeade Primary School
- Providing any other information they would like to share.

Students will use information from their applications to support the answers of these questions. Students will then **present their speeches** next **Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> November**, covering the same information above to the voting current student leaders, and year 4 and 5 students. All students will vote in their 'houses', experiencing the electoral process. The speeches will not be filmed.

Volleyball Finals. The volleyball teams this semester have been very successful. Both teams won their individual divisions during the interschool Lightning Premiership competition. Both teams were then given the chance to compete at the Divisional Finals, held at Tulliallan Primary School. Unfortunately, despite their best efforts, the girls' volleyball team were defeated. Even though the students were upset, they showed excellent sportsmanship by congratulating the winning school and demonstrating the school's I Respect values. The mixed team won their game in straight sets and were given the opportunity to participate in the Regional Volleyball Finals held at Springers Leisure Centre in Keysborough. All of the games at this level were officiated by professional umpires and the standard of all of the teams was very high.
