

Learning Intention: To use your prior knowledge to make predictions and ask questions about the book.

USE BACKGROUND KNOWLEDGE ASK QUESTIONS

- Make a list of the things you **already know** about animal habitats. •
- Write down **3 questions about animal habitats** that you hope the book can answer.

Learning Intention: To identify the main idea and to find facts to back up your idea.

• Make a list of the animals you see and the habitat they live in (pages 8-17). Describe their habitat. Does that back up what you are saying about the Main Idea?



Learning Intention: To recognise cause and effect and to make connections.

Read 'Animal Habitats' pages 18 – 21. Discuss with an adult what you see.

- RECOGNIZE CAUSE AND EFFECT
- Can you find an example of cause and effect on page 20?
 - Cause is why something happened (*hint: What happened to the forest?)

Effect is what happens to the animals.




What connections can you make after reading this book? CONNECTIONS
