DAY 2



Learning Intention: To use the glossary to label pictures in a nonfiction book.



Listen to the book again.



Read to an adult.



- Look at page 22. The author has used the glossary to help you know
- what the words mean. It will help you to label the picture.



Draw a picture of a spider and label it.



Talk to an adult about your picture and labels.

DAY 3



Learning Intention: To use the glossary to help you understand new words.



Listen to the book again.



Read the book to someone in your family. Find the words in **bold** type. Look at the glossary on page 23 to find out what these words mean.



Choose two interesting words. Look at their meaning in the glossary.

Write an interesting sentence using each word.



Talk to an adult about your sentences.



Learning Intention: Show your understanding about spiders.



Choose one or more of these activities:

Draw a spider in its habitat.



Write a story about a spider or another creepy crawly that you know.



Describe a spider you have seen.



Research some interesting information about different types of spiders.
