Write a letter to Jill or the giant telling them what lesson you learnt.

DAY 3



Learning Intention: To compare and contrast two characters.



Listen to the book again.



Read the book to someone in your family.



Think about Jill and the giant.



Think about what is the same about them – **compare.**




Thing about what is different about them – **contrast**.




Create a Venn diagram thinking about the 2 characters.
