

Learning Intention: To know that pictures can help you understand a story.





Read to an adult.






The boy says he was 'out in my jungle'.

Tell an adult how the pictures helped you understand the story.










DAY 3



Learning Intention: To notice rhyming words in the text.



Listen to the book again.




Read the book to someone in your family.

Look at this page from your book.







Look through your book.

DAY 4



Some more activities if you choose...

Learning Intention: To show what you know about real and imaginary jungle animals.

Choose one or more of these activities:

Think of some pretend animals that you might see in a pretend jungle.

Draw pictures of your pretend animals. Think of some silly names for your animals.


Make a book about your pretend jungle.

Research some real jungle animals. Draw the animals you found. Write their names.

Ask an adult to help you find the book or clip, 'Rumble in the Jungle.'
