DAY 2



Learning Intention: To notice and use sentence patterns when reading.

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Listen to the book again.

Read to an adult.

Look at these pages from the book.



The sentences are the same except for the last word.

We can use the **sentence pattern** to help us read the next page.



Check through the book. Is the sentence pattern

the same on every page? Use the sentence pattern to



write another sentence about the monkey's balloon.

Talk to an adult about how sentence patterns help you to read.


DAY 3



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- Listen to the book again.



Read the book to someone in your family.





- Look through the pages in your book. Look at the Monkey. He looks happy.
- Look at the last page of your book. Look at the monkey's face.
- He is not happy now that the balloon is down.
- The pictures show you his feelings.



Draw a picture of someone doing something that makes them happy.



- Draw a picture of them feeling sad when things go wrong.
- Tell an adult how pictures show that the character's feelings have changed.

Learning Intention: To show what you know about sentence patterns.

Make a book called, 'The Sleepy Monkey'. Use this sentence pattern.
