Remember to include the setting, and to retell the story in order.

Think of the beginning, middle and end.

Learning Intention: To demonstrate your understanding and purpose of pictures in a text.



Listen to the book again.



Read to an adult.

Read page 18. Look at the pictures and notice the arrows.







Write what the boys did to create the birdhouse.



How have the pictures on this page helped you understand the story? Share your writing with an adult.

Words that sound the same and end the same way sop + hop cat + hat tag + bag lip + sip pet + wet bug + rug

Learning Intention: To identify rhyming words in the book.



Listen to the book again.

Read the book to someone in your family.



This is the nest on the ground that fell from the branch without a sound.

This is part of the book.

There is **rhyming** on each page.

On this page the rhyming words are 'ground' and 'sound'.

These would have the same ending.



Look through the book and write down all the rhyming words you can find.

Remember there are 2 on each page.



Share your words with an adult. Can you think of another rhyming word to add?

Learning Intention: Show your understanding of the text and concepts taught.

- Choose one or more of these activities:
- Using paper cups and spoons make some rhyming cups with different endings for e.g., all, -ake, ile, -at, -ide.



DAY 4

Write instructions on how to make something e.g., how to build a Lego house, a paper plane or make slime.

With parent help, find and follow a recipe on how to cook something yummy to share with your family.
