Learning Intention: To read the book, 'I Hug.'



Listen to the book.



Read along with an adult.




Copy a favourite picture from the book and tell an adult why you chose it.



Talk to an adult about what you have read.









Learning Intention: To make a personal connection to the text.



Read to an adult.

Listen to the book again.



- Each page shows you something that the girl hugs.
- Do any of these pages remind you of something that you like to hug?

When we read or see a character doing something, it reminds us of things we

have done. This is called making a connection to the text.




Look through the book again. Find something else that you make a connection with. Write and draw the **connection** you made.



Ask an adult if they also made a connection with something they saw in this book.









Learning Intention: To recognise words which rhyme with 'hug'.

Listen to the book again.

Read the book to someone in your family.



Rhyming words sound the same - 'cat' sounds like 'bat'

hug dug bug rhyme with hug.

Copy these rhyming words and write more words that rhyme with hug. Draw a picture for each word.



Tell an adult your rhyming words. Can they think of any other words that rhyme with hug?





Some more activities if you choose...

Learning Intention: To show what you learned from the book, 'Hug.'

Choose one or more of these activities:



This book is about things the girl liked to hug. Look at this **HUG** card. Use scissors, paper and glue to make a **HUG** card

for someone you like to hug.



I would **not** like to hug a lion.



Make a funny book about things you would **not** like to hug.

Ask an adult to help you read or listen to 'Hug' by Jez Alborough Talk to an adult about the book and how it made you feel.
