

Read along with an adult.




Copy a favourite picture from the book and tell an adult why you chose it.

DAY 2



Learning Intention: To know that non-fiction books have information

that matches the title page.



Listen to the book again.




Read to an adult.



Look at these pages from your book.

The **title page** asks, 'What is Soft?'

The pages show things that are soft.











The information in the book matches the title page.

Look through the book. Write and draw all the things that are soft.



Tell an adult what you know about the information and title page in a non-fiction book.

DAY 3



Learning Intention: To know that 'th' makes a 'th' sound.



Listen to the book again.



Read the book to someone in your family.



The letters t and h make a 'th' sound together.

Look at this page from your book.

'Th' starts the words this that the them they




Look through your book.

DAY 4



Learning Intention: To show what you know about the title page of a book.

Choose one or more of these activities:

Make the new book about soft toys. Write and draw a soft toy on each page.

Your teddy bear is a soft toy. Write about a teddy bear that had an exciting,

imaginary adventure.

Ask an adult to help you read or watch the book 'The Very Cranky Bear.'
