


Learning Intention: To use different strategies to solve unknown words.

DAY 2






Learning Intention: To show your understanding of a text feature. Read to an adult.



Non-fiction books have many text features. Text features are extra

visuals and print that authors include in books and other texts to help the reader understand the information better. Every page of this book has a **heading.**



- The headings tell you what you are going to be reading about.
- Look at pages 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 and read the headings.



Write the heading and name 2 other animals that could be added to that page.

Learning Intention: To identify and use 'verbs' from the text.

Listen to the book again.

DAY 3

Read the book to someone in your family.

The author describes the way the animals move. These movements are called 'verbs'.

Snakes slide their bodies in curves.

In this sentence the verb is 'slide'.

It is the action the snake was doing.



As you look through the text, find and write all the verbs the author used. Can you think of other verbs that could have been used?

Share your writing with an adult.

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Some more activities if you choose...

Learning Intention: To show understanding of the concepts taught.

Choose one or more of these activities:



Ask an adult to help you find a video explaining the **text features** in non-fiction books.

Use toy animals to make them demonstrate different actions.

Look for other animal books and compare it to the one you read.



Write a story using some of the animals from the book.

Draw what happens, and then write about it.



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
