
Thursday 25th March is a Free Dress Day by gold coin donation. This is a fundraiser for our Easter raffle (tickets are available for purchase).

PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES



If you are having trouble booking an interview online, please contact the office. If you require a translator for your interview please get in touch with your child's teacher or a member of the office team.



This week will be a focus on the red zone. The Red Zone is used to describe extremely heightened states of alertness and intense emotions. A person may be elated or experiencing anger, rage, devastation, or terror when in the red zone." https://

We educate students to know, no zone is "bad" and that they are all normal feelings. We focus on strategies that can help us when we are in the Red zone. Although some strategies will work for us differently, there are some common strategies that work for lots of students when they feel in the Red zone, such as:

- Running
- Taking time to reflect
- Talking to trusted adults
- Breathing exercises
- Drinking water


The zones language is used every day in all classes to build emotional literacy, the Zones of Regulation is unpacked through the positive Start Program and students have an opportunity to design and come up with strategies that they can use to support them to self-regulate. Goals of The **ZONES** Curriculum

Teaches students

- Identify their feelings and levels of alertness
- Understand their feelings in context
- Effective regulation tools
- When and how to use tools
- Problem solve positive solutions
- Understand how their behaviours influence others' thoughts and feelings

And ultimately move towards Independent Regulation

Look at their creativity, they are enjoying being artists while learning about life cycles!






Learning to identify letters and sounds supports young readers and writers to develop phonological awareness. Ms Papa is showing her students how to stretch sounds to read words.
